Write at least 4 thought provoking questions

WALK TWO MOONS: We spent more time reading the amazing Walk Two Moons. I (Ms.

S) love read aloud. Every time I hear what you think as we read the book, you make me understand the book better. In one chapter, called, Breaking In, Sal remembers looking at objects her mom gave her to try and remember everything about the day she gave them. She tried to remember the weather and what her mom was wearing. She said it was, "a crucial thing to do." She didn't want her mom to "disappear forever". We talked

about memories and how strange and non-logical they can be. Sometimes, we wish we had paid more attention to the "smaller' moments so we would have more memories. The "lunatic" left another message that said, "You never know the worth of water until the well is dry." We talked about this too. We talked about how Phoebe Winterbottom thought it meant her mom had fallen into a well. She could not see the message was a metaphor. Ask your parents if they agree with the Cesare Pavese quote. (Cesare Pavese was an Italian writer and poet). Spend some time discussing memories and what made them linger in your mind. Do you think you can "hold on' to memories?

**ECONOMICS**: We are thinking about how the people and environment are affected by the materials we buy and use. For example, we looked at an interesting series about where our clothing is made, how it is made and the people who make it. YOU asked the following excellent questions: Do you think it's worth, making our shirts more expensive so that workers get paid more? Why or why not? Should you buy clothing that is made in places that do not take care of their workers? Why do you think garment workers in Bangladesh are willing to work for such low wages? If you stopped buying goods that were made in bad conditions, would it be better or worse for the workers? Talk about the pros and cons. Ask your parents if there are certain types of materials (cars, clothes, food, etc) where they pay more attention to where and how it was made than others. We also looked at different fabrics and thought about what is man made and what isn't? When does something become man made? Riley wonders why it says man made instead of human made.

mom did all the cooking, cleaning, sewing, baking and home care before she disappeared. When she left, her household was in turmoil because they were so used to her doing everything for them.
